      - c. Postmillennialism.
      - d. A-millennialism the historic position of the church since Augustine (400 AD.)
    - 3. Prof. Engelsma's Standard Bearer articles on Eschatology has covered much of the controversy.

      - d. The second death is described in Rev. 20:14; what is it?
    - 3. Why does the second death have no power over these souls?
    - 4. What does these saints do?

    - 1. What does he do then?
    - 2. What do the nations do? Compare this with Rev. 16:13, 14, 16. Is there a connection?
