Revelation 21:1-22 The Blessedness of Heaven for the Child of God

Introduction: A New Section

- 1. Revelation sets forth Christ's work and His coming in all the new dispensation.
 - a. It leads to the development of the Antichristian kingdom and then its destruction.
 - 1) The seven seals, trumpets, and vials bring about this development and the destruction.
 - 2) Satan and his host, the false prophet, the antichrist, and all the wicked are cast into hell.
 - b. The last two chapters are positive revealing the new creation, and the blessedness of the saints.

 - c. Why is there no sea? (What does the sea do in this earth that God would not want to happen in the new?)
 - 3. The new Jerusalem comes from heaven to the earth.
 - a. Will the Church not dwell in heaven?
 - b. How will the new heaven and earth be connected? (See Eph. 1:10.)
 - C. The Blessed Condition.
 - 1. What things will be missing from this creation that will make it blessed?
 - 2. How will the needs of the Church be supplied?
 - 3. To what does the water of life refer?
